Herman Wouk was born in New York City in 1915. He graduated in comparative literature and philosophy from Columbia University and then worked for five years as script-writer for one of America's leading radio comedians.

In 1942 he joined the U.S. Navy and in 1943 Ensign Wouk reported for duty aboard a destroyer-minesweeper which was operating in the Pacific. He served with distinction for three years and emerged from 'the greatest experience of my life' with the material for his Pulitzer Prize novel, *The 'Caine' Mutiny*.

Herman Wouk is married and has two sons. He and his wife live in Washington.
